Rebates

Rebates are applicable to residential customers only.

- **Holders of Centrelink Health Care Cards and Pensioner Concession Cards** are entitled to reduced fees on meter testing and rebates on:
 - Account establishment fee
 - Supply charge
- **Holders of Seniors Cards** are entitled to a rebate on the supply charge.
- **Customers with dependent children**, who are eligible for supply charge rebates are also entitled to a rebate on a proportion of the energy charge.
- **Holders of Veteran Affairs Gold Cards** (War Widow, Dependent, Totally and Permanently Incapacitated) and **Pensioner Concession Cards** are entitled to reduced meter testing fees and to rebates on the supply charge and account establishment fees.
- **In multiple residences** where the electricity is supplied through one main Horizon Power meter, each additional residence is also charged a supply charge. A rebate may be claimed by eligible customers.
- **Eligible seniors and dependent child rebate recipients** are also entitled to a rebate to offset the electricity costs associated with operating an air conditioner.
- **A Hardship Assistance Package** provides additional assistance to eligible customers. If you are experiencing financial hardship, please telephone us to find out if you may be eligible for additional assistance through the Hardship Utilities Grant Scheme.
- **The Thermoregulatory Dysfunction Energy Subsidy Scheme and Life Support Equipment Electricity Subsidy** are also available for eligible customers. These Schemes are administered by the Office of State Revenue. For more information visit www.dtf.wa.gov.au

North West Interconnected System and Regional Non Interconnected Systems Effective 1 July 2011

Residential Tariff (A2)

The A2 tariff is the standard residential tariff, which is available to private dwellings (houses, home units, flats, apartments, etc) used solely for residential purposes. It offers customers the same flat rate energy charge regardless of where they live and which time of the day electricity is used.

Customers with specific needs

Community Service Tariff (C2)

The C2 tariff is available to small voluntary and charitable organisations. Customers seeking supply under this tariff must apply in writing to Horizon Power, providing evidence which clearly demonstrates they meet all the conditions listed in the *Energy Operators (Regional Power Corporation) (Charges) By-Laws 2006*, a copy of which is available from the Horizon Power website or the State Government website at www.slp.wa.gov.au

Charitable Accommodation Tariff (D2)

The D2 tariff is available to charitable or benevolent organisations (premises for which the A2 tariff is not available) providing residential accommodation. A supply charge of 28.46 cents per day for each additional residence is applicable. For charitable accommodation, the number of residences is determined by dividing the total number of beds by five and rounding up to the next whole number.

Residential and Business Tariff (K2)

The K2 tariff is available to customers who use electricity partly for residential and partly for business purposes.

Small Business Tariff (L2)

The L2 tariff is available to customers where electricity is used for business purposes and at low/medium voltage (240/415 V), with consumption up to 50 MWh per annum (up to 137 units per day on average).

Medium/Large Business Tariff (L4)

The L4 tariff is available to customers where the electricity is used for business purposes and at low/medium voltage (240/415 V), with consumption of 50 MWh or more per annum (greater than 137 units per day on average).

New commercial customers should discuss their electricity needs and pricing with their local Horizon Power representative.

Regional Non Interconnected Systems Tariff (N2)

The N2 tariff is available to Commonwealth and Foreign Government instrumentalities that are supplied from a Regional Non Interconnected System*.

North West Interconnected System Tariff (P2)

The P2 tariff is available to Commonwealth and Foreign Government instrumentalities that are supplied from the North West Interconnected System**.

Business customers with high electricity usage

General Supply (High Voltage) Tariff (M2)

This tariff is available to customers supplied at 6.6 kV, 11 kV, 22 kV or 33 kV. The customer must own all equipment (except metering equipment) on the load side of their high voltage terminals. Conditions apply. Telephone 1800 737 036 for further details.
